

NYS Pandemic Unemployment Update

Published April 6, 2020.

The President signed a new law that enhances the current unemployment system. The law added three new items surrounding unemployment.

- 1. Pandemic Unemployment Assistance
 - Extends eligibility to self-employed workers and independent contractors
- 2. Pandemic Unemployment Compensation
 - > An additional \$600 per week
- 3. Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation
 - An additional 13 Weeks beyond the regular 26 weeks of UI benefits (39 weeks total)

Individuals should keep in mind there are restrictions on who is eligible under the pandemic program.
